




Here's a top tip from Bence while working on his MG midget brakes. Cover the shoes with masking tape to keep your greasy finger prints off of them.



MANY OF YOU WILL BE SURPRISED TO LEARN THAT I HAVE BEEN QUIETLY WORKING ON THIS PROJECT FOR MANY YEARS. IT IS SLOW GOING AND I HAVE BEEN AT IT OFF AND ON FOR QUITE SOME TIME. THIS IS WHERE IT STANDS AS OF NOW.



I FIRST GOT THE CAR. AT ABOUT THE TURN OF THE CENTURY, (THAT SOUNDS ODD DOES IT NOT?) THE MG TC CAME IN A BOX AND WAS COMPLETELY DISASSEMBLED. I EXCITEDLY GOT THE BOX HOME AND PROCEEDED TO INSPECT ALL THE BITS WITHIN. THIS WOULD BE A HUGE TASK., FIRST STEP WAS TO CLEAN ALL THE PARTS AND LAY THEM OUT IN SOME SORT OF LOGICAL ORDER.

WITH THE HELP OF A GOOD INSTRUCTION MANUAL I BEGAN WITH THE CHASSIS. AS THE CAR, WAS IN BITS IT WAS A FAIRLY SIMPLE TASK TO PAINT THE FRAME RAILS INDIVIDUALLY, ONCE DRY AND USING THE CROSS MEMBERS I RATHER QUICKLY HAD THE COMPLETE CHASSIS READY TO ACCEPT THE RUNNING GEAR.

PLITTING THE ENGINE TOGETHER WAS NOT TOO DIFFICULT AS I HAD DONE THIS SORT OF THING BEFORE, THE KEY IS TO TAKE YOUR TIME, I DEBATED WHETHER TO PAINT IT BEFORE OR AFTER ASSEMBLY, I ELECTED TO PAINT ALL OF THE COMPONENTS INDIVIDUALLY BEFORE HAND. THIS WOULD MAKE IT EASIER TO NEATLY PAINT EVERYTHING IN THE VARIOUS COLOURS REQUIRED FOR A PROPER REPRESENTATION OF THE ORIGINAL AS IT LEFT THE ABINGDON FACTORY A VERY LONG TIME AGO. SUSPENSION ASSEMBLY WAS A SIMPLE MATTER OF USING THE MANUAL AND PROCEEDING ONE STEP AT A TIME.

IT WAS ABOUT HERE THAT I TEMPORARILY LOST, NOT INTEREST, BUT MOMENTUM, WITH THE BUILD. IT WAS PUT ASIDE AND SAT IDLE FOR SOME TIME, NO EXCUSE REALLY. FINALLY I WAS ABLE TO REKINDLE THE ENTHUSIASM REQUIRED TO GET ON WITH IT. HERE ARE A FEW MORE "PROGRESS REPORT" PHOTOS.
















#### RUN AWAY RAMPS Words and photos by T.W.Pugh

ARE YOU TIRED AND SNAGGED OUT AFTER CHASING YOUR RAMPS ALL OVER THE GARAGE/SHOP/DRIVEWAY WITH YOUR BRITISH CAR? I KNOW I WAS, SO DECIDED TO DO SOMETHING ABOUT IT, I SHALL NOW SHARE WITH YOU, IN WORDS AND PHOTOS, HOW I PUT AN END TO THE MADNESS.

FIRST UP WAS TO ACQUIRE A SET OF CHEAP HOLDBOWN STRAPS. ONES FROM THE BOLLAR STORE ARE PERFECTLY GOOD AS YOU ARE JUST GOING TO DRIVE OVER THEM ANYWAY, ORDINARY ROPE WILL WORK AS WELL, BUT THE STRAPS LAY FLAT.



ATTACH THE HOOK ENDS OF THE STRAPS TO YOUR RAMPS BY ANY MEANS POSSIBLE. IN THIS CASE MY RAMPS ARE MADE OF WOOD AND HOMEMADE, SO I USED AN GOOD SIZED EYE HOOK WITH A SCREW END. NEXT ARRANGE THE RAMPS ON YOUR SLIPPERY GARAGE/SHOP/DRIVEWAY WHEEL TRACK WIDTH APART. STRETCH THE CARGO STRAPS BACK FROM THE RAMPS WHEEL WIDTH WIDE. NOTE THAT THE STRAPS NEED TO BE AT LEAST AS LONG AS YOUR CAR. THE FOLLOWING PHOTOS WILL EXPLAIN. SLOWLY DRIVE YOUR CAR FORWARD ONTO THE EXTENDED STRAPS. ONCE THE FRONT WHEELS CONTACT THE EDGE OF THE SLIBEY RAMPS THE REAR WHEELS SHOULD BE ON THE STRAPS. THIS WILL ENABLE YOU TO SMOOTHLY DRIVE UP ONTO THEM WHILE NELD FIRMLY IN PLACE.



# The 2024 Fraser Valley Classic Car Show

In response to canvasing by Bruce Webster, Member at Large for Car Shows, an Organizing Committee was formed for the 2024 Show. The members are Bruce Webster, Michael Hamilton-Clark, Mike McChesney, Laurie Rae and John Webster. The first meeting was held on 26 September 2023. Regular monthly meetings have been continued with members reporting their progress for items on the Job List and discussions for further action. Two major jobs in which Bruce was the lead have been completed: Securing a Presenting Sponsor and permission to use the UFV Chilliwack Campus area used in previous Shows. He has also secured catering arrangements and garbage collection/disposal. Laurie has been busy on number of fronts such as organizing St. John's Ambulance, Porta Potties, the Marching Band and two car dealerships for displays. Mike has taken on Registrar and Registration activities. John has been busy sourcing someone to provide and run the P/A system and incidental music. Michael H-C managed to arrange for getting the FVCCS website returned to Club control and Bruce's son Dan Webster has put in some sterling work on re-populating the site for the 2024 Show. Doug Holbrow has confirmed that tents and a genset that were provided through him can be made available and be taken to and from the Show site.

Sarah Toop of Sarah Toop Real Estate Group, attended the 28 November meeting and handed over her Presenting Sponsor's cheque for \$5,000. We also have Simpson Auto as a Bronze \$250 Sponsor and two Supporters with Gift certificates. So, with \$558 in the bank from the 2022 Show, there is now some \$5,800 in the bank account, well and enough to meet Show set-up expenses.

One of the targets was to have the Registration Form sorted out by 31 December. With some concentrated work and Dan Webster's help on Google Sheets this is set to be achieved and Registration will be able to be put in hand early in the New Year.

On the day of the Show – Sunday 9 June 2024 – help will be required on a number of fronts for installation of tents, rope fencing and vehicle positioning.
